Serve One Another

Grab a notepad and pencil and gather around the table. Make a list for each family member showing some of the major tasks/responsibilities each person has around the home. Examples could be "Mom: laundry, dishes, grocery shopping" or "Dad: vacuuming, washing the car, helping with homework" or "Sister: setting the table, putting away dishes, etc." Select one task for each person and write each on a separate slip of paper. Shuffle the slips of paper and pass one out to each person. Make sure that each person receives another person's task for the week. Then serve one another by completing that person's task all week long. Consider make it a game by trying to complete each task without the other family members knowing! Talk about how Jesus served us by giving His life. He made it possible for us to live forever with God.





Word of Wonder Eggy Jumble

Gather 18 plastic eggs, 18 slips of paper, a pencil, a basket, and some upbeat music (check out the Connected Easter Worship@Home Spotify playlist for some ideas!). Write the Word of Wonder on the slips of paper, one word per slip: "I will spend time thinking about everything you have done. I will consider all your mighty acts" (Psalm 77:12, NIrV). Include the reference on one slip as well. Fold and hide one slip of paper inside each plastic egg. Jumble the eggs in a basket, play some tunes, and see how long it takes for your family to open, empty, and sequence the slips of paper into the right order. Read the Word of Wonder together, and hop like bunnies to celebrate putting the words in order! Then sit and brainstorm what kinds of mighty acts God has done. Feel free to look through a picture Bible for inspiration.
