ISAIAH 54:1-2

Shout for joy, O barren one who has borne no children; burst into song and shout, you who have not been in labor!

For the children of the desolate woman will be more than the children of the one who is married, says the LORD. Enlarge the site of your tent, and let the curtains of your habitations be stretched out; do not hold back; lengthen your cords and strengthen your stakes.

Then Elijah said to him, "Go back again, for what have I done to you?"






